Each of these individuals have contributed tremendously towards the growth of this mine and we are indeed grateful for their dedication.




A TRIBUTE TO A CHAMPION OF THE LESOTHO DIAMOND INDUSTRY

Ntate Keith Whitelock passed away on the 1st September 2023, at a good innings age of 90 . He was a champion of the natural diamond industry and the principal driver behind reviving the diamond industry in Lesotho in the late 1990s - early 2000s when he reopened Letseng. The King honoured Keith with the Country's highest award for his contributions in this regard.

His history with Lesotho dates back to the "Basutoland days" of Jack Scott, where he went on to lead the exploration effort by Maluti Diamond Corporation (Newmont) in the late 1960s - early 1970s, where his team discovered, and sampled, most of the kimberlites known in Lesotho today. This included Kao, which he brought into the then-listed Namakwa Diamonds stable in December 2009.

Keith led the setting up of Kao from 2010 through to commissioning in early 2012 followed by the initial production phase in 2012 after which he left to pursue various other smaller kimberlite options right until his passing.



GRADUATION OF STUDENTS FROM NTLAFATSO SKILLS TRAINING CENTER



On Thursday 06th July 2023, 36 youth from Kao villages surrounding the operations of the mine who had been admitted to Ntlafatso Skills Training Center were graduating in the following disciplines: Cooking and catering, plumbing and bricklaying.

Ntlafatso Skills Training Centre is a vocational skills training institution in Mohale's Hoek fully sponsored by Kao Mine which offers skills training in cooking and catering, plumbing, bricklaying, motor mechanics, panel beating and spray painting, carpentry, sewing and computer and business skills

The institution was dilapidated, closed and not operational due to lack of funds until 2019 when SMD went into partnership with the institution which led to the renovation and maintenance of the facility. Not only did the mine renovate and maintain the school, but it also procured meals for consumption of the students for the duration of their studies, learning aids, teaching materials and equipment amongst others. The youth are also fully sponsored with tuition, stipend, transport, and medical needs.

In order to ensure investment beyond the life of mine, to date, 57 youth from Kao have graduated from the institution and SMD will continue to fully sponsor the youth of Kao until they have all acquired at least one skill in order to increase their employability or to capacitate them to create their own work/jobs because the future of this country is in the hands of the youth of this country.

SUPPORTING LOCAL GOVERNANCE IN INCOME GENERATION FOR IMPRROVED SERVICE DELIVERY



Local government is key in leading and supporting the creation of community development strategies. The goal of providing revenue to maintain, grow and improve service delivery is one that Storm Mountain Diamonds (SMD) holds dear for the improvement of Kao community.

It is for this that on the 11th of May 2023, SMD handed over to the Nqoe Community Council five houses to assist in the council income generation activities.



These houses were received on behalf of the council by the Honorable Minister of Local Government, Chieftainship, Home Affairs and Police Honorable Lebona Lephema, in a handover event that was also graced with the presence of Minister in the Prime Minister's Office Honorable Limpho Tau, Member of Parliament for Motete Constituency Honorable Teboho Mojapela, and other senior government officials.

With a litany of responsibilities that characterize Ngoe Community Council, SMD saw it befitting to assist the council with houses that would help generate the much-needed income for the council. These houses shall be rented out to generate the much needed revenue for the council.

Storm Mountain Diamonds (SMD) on Thursday 11, May 2023 held a handover ceremony of the newly built and furnished Health Post in the Sekiring (Porenki) village within the Kao community.

The health post is a result of SMD's commitment to Kao community development as expressed in the mine's Community Investment Program for Kao.
For SMD, realizing the need to ensure healthy lives and promote well-

being for all at all ages is an integral part of the mine's business strategy and a framework. This strategy further involves community engagement and that of other stakeholders to support sustainable development initiatives, national priorities and international conventions.

The construction and handover of the health post is thus one of the many

developmental activities that SMD has currently engaged in, which are also compliant to the Sustainable Development Goals, particularly SDG 3 which speaks to the need to ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages.



The furnished Katlehong Health Post will serve a great deal to ease the frustrations of communities that had to walk between 15 and 20km to the nearest health facility at Rampai village for medical help. The health post will therefore assist Rampai clinic to accommodate the medical needs of all the people living in the Kao area

The handover of the "Katlehong" Health Post was graced with the presence of Minister in the Prime Minster's Office Honorable Limpho Tau, Minister of Local Government, Chieftainship, Home Affairs and Police Honorable Lebona Lephema, Member of Parliament for Motete Constituency Honorable Teboho Mojapela, and other high ranking government officials

SMD INJECTS IN WOOL & MOHAIR INDUSTRY



Storm Mountain Diamonds (SMD) through its Community Investment Strategy has donated 43 high breed rams and 86 pregnant ewes to the farmers in Kao. The farmers that benefited from this initiative are those residing in Ha Shishila, Lihloahloeng, Porenki, and Nokeng, which are villages surrounding the operations of the mine

This initiative is meant to improve the breed of sheep of farmers residing in Kao in order to produce high quality wool which will sell at competitive prices in the market and thus improve the livelihoods of the communities surrounding our operations



This is the second time that SMD invests greatly into the wool and mohair industry through the donation of rams and sheep. In 2022, SMD donated 30 high breed rams to the Motete Wool and Mohair Association. The mine further ensured the construction of offices, kitchen and five accommodation rooms for the personnel working at the woolshed during the wool shearing season.



CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP



Storm Mountain Diamonds (SMD) through its Community Investment Strategy (CIS) facilitated for a three-day training of community associations. The workshop aimed to capacitate these community associations with the requisite skills that would ensure they run them to their member's benefit. The workshop was administered by the Ministry of Defence, National Security and Environment through the Department of Forestry and Ministry of Trade, Industry, Business Development & Tourism

The two associations that benefited from this training are the Bees Association of Lihloahloeng and Kopanang Basotho, all of which are found in the surrounding communities of Kao mine operations
